Principal's Report

2012 has been a fulfilling year. The registration renewal of the school enabled a comprehensive review of policies within the changing national agendas of curriculum and professional standards for teachers. Combined with the review of public funding for all Australian schools, led by David Gonski, the year has been marked by much reflection and planning.

Through the Strategic Plan the Board has sought to consolidate the planning which brings the school to full enrolments from Preschool to Year 12. The school continues to maintain increasingly strong waiting lists.

The release of the government's white paper on the importance of engaging with our Asian neighbours was an important perspective in the context of the school's aims and directions. Burgmann is one of the few schools to teach Indonesian from Kindergarten to Year 12. Combined with the experience of taking 60 Senior School students to Kunming and the Ringa Valley in China in 2012, the school's commitment to encouraging our community to understand and relate to countries in our region can be seen as a priority.

The conclusion of semester one saw a busy and very productive era in the Senior School draw to a close with the departure of Dr Kerrie Wilde. Dr Wilde has a passion for young people to achieve their very best academically while challenging them to contribute generously to society. The school thanks Dr Wilde for her commitment to and passion for education while at Burgmann.

Our first school musical, 'All Shook Up', was a spectacular success. Students in Middle and Senior Schools trod the boards with passion, enthusiasm and performed with confidence and great expertise. Audiences were rewarded by energetic and engaging performances both on the stage and from the band.

As a school with a deep commitment to building community through a servant heart, our students have engaged with many charities and worthy causes to raise both much need resources and awareness. 2012 saw Burgmann raise significant funds for Anglicare throughout the year.

Teamwork, commitment and passion describe much of what drives staff and students. These, combined with the generous support and encouragement of parents, have helped define 2012 as a year of shaping hearts in an affirmative and generous manner.

I thank all staff members for their commitment and dedication. I also wish to thank the Executive team for their energy and passion and our students for their commitment, enthusiasm and curiosity and empathy for others displayed throughout 2012.

In 2012 Burgmann Anglican School reached the milestone of enrolling over 1500 students (3 pre to Year 12) across our two campuses with student numbers in Senior School exceeding 400.

The school underwent the registration renewal process required of all schools in the ACT every five years. I thank our Principal, Steven Bowers and all of the staff and students involved for ensuring that the extensive documentation and other requirements were presented to the Registration Panel in such a professional and comprehensive way, ensuring that we were granted registration until 2017 by the Minister for Education.

The Board spent much time discussing the potential impact of the Review of Funding for Schooling (chaired by David Gonski) on our school and at the time of writing awaits the release of the final report. Within the framework provided by the Strategic Plan, the Board also continued to discuss and plan for the future needs and development of the school.

After 18 productive months in the Senior School, Dr Kerrie Wilde departed to travel and pursue other professional interests. The Board thanks Dr Wilde for her significant contribution to the Senior School programs during her time with us and wishes her well for the future. We welcomed Mr John Foulcher to the Deputy Principal Valley Campus, Head of Senior School position.

The school community was treated to the inaugural school musical, *All Shook Up* which was a great success. The Board appreciates the effort required from staff, students and parents who were involved in this excellent production. It was a wonderful way to share with the wider community some of the educational and performance opportunities that are on offer to students at Burgmann Anglican School.

The school continued to enjoy the support of the Parents and Friends Association and although the annual fair was cancelled due to bad weather, the community rallied and enjoyed a shorter twilight event a couple of weeks after the scheduled date. We also continue to be blessed by significant parent involvement in our classrooms, on excursions and at cocurricular activities.

I would like to thank Steven Bowers, the school's staff, parents, students and the wider community for continuing to support the school in our goal to shape hearts, inspire minds and build spirit.

Staffing

At the date of the Commonwealth Census in August 2012 the school had 119 teachers (95.6 full time equivalent FTE workload) and 48 non-teaching staff (37.1 FTE).

Fifteen permanent staff left the school in 2012 due to personal reasons.

Five members of the school's staff were on maternity leave during 2012.

At the date of the Commonwealth Census in August 2012 the school had 16.8 Primary students per Primary teacher; and 13.0 Secondary students per Secondary teacher. The school's average teaching staff ratio across the whole school (excluding Preschool) was 14.8 students per teacher. There were 38.2 students per non-teaching staff member (excluding Preschool).

Comparing the school's staffing in the 2011 and 2012 Commonwealth Census, the school's retention rate for teachers was 90.3% based on FTE.

The average attendance rate for teachers in 2012 was 94.6%.

No staff members identify themselves as of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin.

Industrial Movements

During 2012 there were pay increases of:

- Teachers 3.6%
- Non Teaching Staff 3.6%

The Teachers' Agreement runs until 31 January 2014. In 2013 teachers will receive increases of 4%.

The Non-Teaching Agreement runs until 31 March 2016. The Non-Teaching Staff will receive increases of 4% in 2013.

Professional Learning & Accreditation

2012 was a year of transition in relation to teacher accreditation and registration processes. At Proficient Teacher career stage, the ACT Teacher Quality Institute (TQI) replaced the Independent School's Teacher Accreditation Authority (ISTAA) as the authority responsible for the Proficient Teacher processes. As a result, school-based support structures and related material were reviewed and rewritten to comply with the new process and new standards.

At the Experienced Teacher career stage, delegates from Burgmann Anglican School were part of a team of writers who developed a new set of Standards that aligned with the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers that will be used by ISTAA across a large number of ACT and NSW Independent Schools from 2013. At the higher career stages of Highly Accomplished Teacher and Lead Teacher, Burgmann Anglican School participated in the ACT pilot of the national certification process that is to be implemented in 2013, with a senior member of staff participating in the pilot as an assessor. Being an active participant in both of these spheres ensures that the school was able to contribute to the implementation of these important processes as well as develop a deep understanding of the impact and influence that such changes will have on teachers in our school.

In addition to the systemic developments outlined above, four teachers gained accreditation as Proficient Teacher and two teachers were accredited at Experienced Teacher. These teachers successfully addressed professional standards through rigorous processes that require commitment to critically reflect and analyse their professional practice.

Curriculum across the school was reviewed and updated as we prepared for the registration renewal process. Phase 1 of the Australian Curriculum was implemented and planning continued for the next phase. In Junior School some new units of work were introduced to ensure students are able to make connections between subjects, while in Middle School Interdisciplinary studies were evaluated and revamped for the beginning of 2013. All other essential learning areas were meshed with the ACT *Every Chance to Learn Framework*. In Senior School, the Australian Curriculum frameworks for Mathematics and English were instigated in Years 9 and 10. Preparations were also undertaken to trial the frameworks in other subject areas.

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care continued to be a focus across the school. The class or core teacher from Kindergarten to Year 8 assumes responsibility for understanding each student in their class, supported by specialist subject teaching staff and the Deputy Head of the Sub-School (Pastoral). In Senior School, the Heads of House and Pastoral Care Tutors are the main point of contact for students.

During 2012, Middle School introduced formalised Pastoral Care and Health and Wellbeing Programs into the timetable and these have proved very effective in supporting students, staff and parents.

The Senior School Pastoral Care program was refined and implemented from Years 9 to 12, with emphasis on resilience and issues facing adolescents in the modern world, in preparation for the appointment of an inaugural Director of Pastoral Care in 2013.

Enrichment

A wide range of Enrichment programs (encompassing learning support and extension activities) ran across each of the sub-schools during 2012. Students were involved in a range of individual or group Enrichment activities that supported them both academically and pastorally. The Junior School Enrichment program was enhanced by the appointment of a specialist mathematics teacher. The time allocation for enrichment in the Senior School was increased and a specialist 'breakout' enrichment area was established. Student transition from one sub-school to the next was a focus throughout 2012.

Some examples of the activities students participated in through the Enrichment program included the listening program, literacy groups, lateral thinking extension groups, numeracy groups, ESL programs, Spellodrome, Numicon, Mathletics, Reading Recovery, Multilit, Modified Programs, a range of external competitions such as GATEways, ICAS and daVinci Decathlon, social skills, science based competitions, film studies and extension through differentiated assessment outlines and tasks.

Cocurricular

The cocurricular program continues to go from strength to strength with over 700 students involved in a variety of activities. Aside from the numerous sporting successes, 2012 saw music and drama students present our first musical, 'All Shook Up'. It was an outstanding success and was enjoyed by audiences from within and outside our school community.

During 2012 students had opportunities to develop skills and experience success in a number of other pursuits. Middle School students entered public speaking competitions and debating teams from Year 8 to 12 competed successfully against other Canberra schools. Junior School students were mentored by Senior School students at Science Club and Senior School students participated in the RACI Titration Competition. Junior and Middle School students continue to be enthusiastic competitors in Tournament of Minds. Senior School students continued to face personal challenges to achieve Duke of Edinburgh Awards.

We greatly appreciate the efforts of all members of our school community in our various cocurricular activities.

Y12 Results

The results of our fifth cohort were pleasing with Jessica Adams and David Easey being jointly awarded Dux of Burgmann with an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 99.7.

85% of the students who received a Year 12 Certificate also received an ATAR with:

- 25% of these students receiving an ATAR of 90 or above
- 47% of Burgmann students receiving an ATAR of 80 or above
- 73% of Burgmann students receiving an ATAR of 65 or above
- New highest course scores were set for Burgmann in Music, Indonesian and Fashion Design
- Our median ATAR was 76.65

Other students recognised at the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies Recognition of Excellence Ceremony were Sarah Atkinson for her achievement in Vocational Studies, Anna Kaufmann for her efforts in Community Service and David Easey for his contribution to the Arts.

The school Board members and staff were invited to complete a questionnaire focussing on the immediate needs and future developments of the school.







Per Capita general recurrent funding from the ACT government increased by 2.9% in 2012. The Commonwealth Government general recurrent grants increased by 3.71% for primary students and 4.18% for secondary students in 2012.







Performance Against Budget

The school performed significantly better than budget in 2012, both in terms of the operating result and cash result.

AGSRC Movement

The Average Government School Recurrent Cost (AGSRC) for 2012 was \$10,056 for Primary Students (an increase of 3.71% from the previous year) and \$12,444 for Secondary Students (an increase of 4.18% from the previous year).

Capital Works

The school commenced renovations in a number of senior school classrooms and toilet facilities in the primary area at Valley campus at the end of 2012. There are no major construction projects planned for the next five years.
