2. Rationale

All Hallows' School recognises the need for fundraising provided that it enhances and builds on the goodwill of the All Hallows' School community. The context in which fundraising occurs ensures that the many and varied ways in which people contribute to the School community are recognised and affirmed. All fundraising is based on the principle that all within the community are encouraged to donate according to their capacity and ability and that all gifts are freely given. All fundraising efforts and promotional material must reflect our School's Mercy ethos and School values.

3. Policy

- 3.1 Fundraising will be conducted by the School in order to:
 - (a) provide the resources necessary in the School for quality education.
 - (b) support charitable and community service projects or activities in our local, national and global community.
- 3.2 Fundraising, outside of fees and levies, will always be on the basis of voluntary participation.
- 3.3 All aspects of fundraising will be under the control of the Principal.
- 3.4 Donations whether in the form of money, goods or services will be appropriately acknowledged in a timely and meaningful way and the acknowledgement will demonstrate that a donor's generosity is appreciated and will advance the mission of All Hallows' School. The School will be respectful of the donors wishes regarding confidentiality and donors may wish their contributions to remain anonymous.
- 3.5 Contributions to fundraising activities may be sought from current and past members of the All Hallows' School community and from appropriate sources in the wider community.
- 3.6 The School will comply with any gifting requirements of the Australian Taxation Office and any other legislative requirements.
- 3.7 Significant changes to fundraising direction or activities will be determined by the Principal, in accordance with this Policy and after consultation with the School Board.
