

SISTER MARGARET MARY EATON | MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE APPLICATION FORM

Sister Margaret Mary (Anne) Eaton was professed on 25 July 1926. She was passionate about music and tutored students on piano, piano accordion, guitar, recorder and percussion instruments. Sister Margaret was a very talented musician and artist. She obtained her Associate of the London College of Music (ACLM) from Trinity College, London, and her Associate diploma in Music, Australia (AmusA), from the University of Western Australia.

Scholarship Conditions

1. The scholarship is open to enrolled students in Years 7-12 in 2027 at Iona Presentation College.
2. The scholarship will be tenable for the student's time at the College provided that conditions are met.
3. The scholarship is awarded by Iona Presentation College to a student studying an instrument or voice and is comprised of the following:
 - Fifteen, thirty-minute lessons per semester.

Please note that music diaries, books and other consumables such as strings, reeds, rosin and slide grease etc are the responsibility of parents.
4. It is the preference of the College that students learn from the College Tutor. In exceptional circumstances and at the discretion of the Director of Music, students may be able to continue lessons with their existing Music Tutor. Any changes to tutelage arrangements can only be made in consultation with the Director of Music and can not commence until authorisation from the College has been received.
5. In order to retain the Scholarship, the student must:
 - Show full attendance at Music lessons
 - Comply with Department Policies regarding notification of sickness and other absences
 - Be an active member of a minimum of two Music Ensembles relevant to the awarded scholarship instrument or another Ensemble as specified by the Director of Music
 - Maintain an active practice regimen, demonstrating continued progress
 - Perform in College Recitals
 - Be enrolled in music as an elective in Year 8 and Year 9. Students in Year 10 and above are strongly encouraged to enrol in elective Music. Where this pathway is not appropriate, a Senior Music Scholar can expect to be allocated additional ensemble or performance responsibilities at the discretion of the Director of Music
 - Support College activities by being an active participant
 - Maintain a consistent level in her academic studies
 - Adhere to and uphold the ethos of the College
6. This scholarship is subject to review and monitoring on a regular basis, by the Director of Music, with a written report being completed by the tutor each semester.
7. The scholarship can be withdrawn by the Director of Music if requirements are not met.
8. The value of the scholarship will be repaid to the College if the student withdraws from the Co-curricular Music Program prior to completion of Year 10.
9. The value of the scholarship will be repaid to the College if the student leaves the College for another school in Perth.
