THE SOCIAL CLIMATE OF THE SCHOOL

The King's Chaplaincy team is involved in a number of programs to support families both in and out of school, particularly focusing on families who have a need of additional support. This is done by a program of working with small groups providing safe places for students to go during break times, being involved in camping programs, organized activities and at times academic help to a limited level. They also are involved in after- hours work assisting families in liaising with youth groups and responding to emergencies. They are also involved in assisting school staff with school activities such as after-hours surfing, excursion, preparation etc.

King's has an anti-bullying and harassment policy which seeks to ensure that a positive College culture is maintained through community leadership, in the form of behavioural boundaries, while also providing the opportunity for spiritual redemption from the impact of sin for all members of the College community.

Next Step 2024 Post-School Destinations

King's Christian College (Reedy Creek)

This is a summary of the post-school destinations of students from King's Christian College (Reedy Creek) who completed Year 12 and gained a Senior Statement in 2023. The results are from the *Year 12 Completers Survey*, which is conducted approximately six months after students completed Year 12.

67.8% response rate

143 out of 211 Year 12 completers from this school responded to the 2024 survey. *Results may not be representative of all Year 12 completers at this school.*

Post-school destinations



In 2024, 95.1% of Year 12 completers from King's Christian College (Reedy Creek) were engaged in education, training or employment in the year after they completed school.



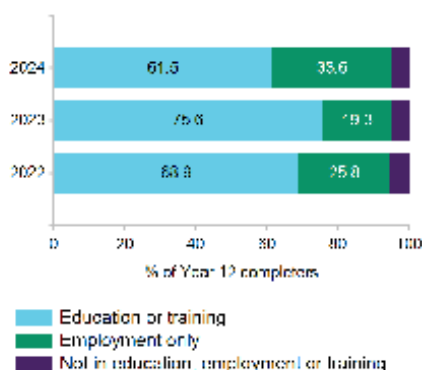
Of the 143 respondents, 61.5% continued in education and training. The most common study destination was bachelor degree.



A further 33.6% transitioned directly into paid employment only.

All Year 12 completers were assigned to a *main destination*. Respondents who were both studying and working are reported as being in education or training, including apprentices and trainees.
