Formal Uniform Specifications

Male	Female
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shorts: College navy shorts with belt loops. • Black Belt: Black belt to be worn with shorts or long pants. • Shirt: College pattern and tucked in at all times. • Tie: Worn at top of shirt collar with all buttons done up (different styles for Years 7–10 and Years 11–12). • Socks: Long blue College socks to be worn up. • Footwear: Polished black leather traditional school shoes with laces (not suede or jogger/ skate/ volley styles). • Trousers (optional): Long grey with belt loops (Senior Campus - compulsory for Masses and formal occasions). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Skirt: College navy skirt. Skirt is to be on the waist and to the top of the knee. • Blouse: College pattern. • Academic Dress: Worn to the top of the knee (blue tie for Years 7–10 and red tie Years 11–12). • Tie: Worn at top of shirt collar with all buttons done up (different styles for Years 7–10 and Years 11–12). • Socks: College or standard white socks (not anklet socks). • Footwear: Polished black leather traditional school shoes with laces (not suede or jogger/ skate/ volley styles). • Stockings (optional): Navy or black stockings/tights may be worn.

Uniform and Presentation

Sports Uniform	<p>Only students doing Physical Education / Sport and Recreation / Certificate III in Fitness need this uniform when doing practical work only.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shirt (blue in colour) / Shorts (navy in colour) / Hat (bucket or sports cap). • House shirts for Years 7 – 10 which can be purchased from Intersport. • White sports socks – need to be visible; NO ankle socks. • Sports shoes (cross trainers – no volleys, high tops, skate shoes etc) with laces (shoes are to be appropriate footwear – the PE Coordinator reserves the right to refuse any footwear deemed to be inappropriate). Shoes will be checked when the students begin the subject to ensure Workplace Health & Safety requirements have been met.
SPC Jacket or Jumper	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • College pattern and crest. • The SPC jacket or jumper may be worn with either the Formal or Sports Uniform. No other jackets or jumpers (including SPC team jumpers or senior jerseys) may be worn.
Headwear	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must wear the College broad-brimmed hat or College cap to and from school, during breaks, between class and for all outdoor activities. • For formal occasions, such as the ANZAC Day Parade, the formal broad-brimmed hat must be worn.
Condition of Uniform	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Uniform must be clean, neat and in good order. • Additions, alterations or substitutions are not accepted unless the House Coordinator has been given a note from the student's parent/guardian which states the reason for the substitution and the length of time this will occur. • A 'Uniform Slip' is issued for single days of incorrect uniform explained by a note from parents/guardians.
Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All articles of clothing should be clearly marked with the student's name.
Footwear	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closed-in shoes must be worn at all times, including free dress days as a requirement of Work Health and Safety (WH&S) legislation. • Appropriate footwear matching industry standards must be worn in the Industrial Technology & Design, Science and Home Economics areas as a requirement of Work Health and Safety (WH&S) legislation. • HPE students must wear shoes that adequately support their foot and can lace up securely. Unlaced/loosely laced skateboarding style shoes are inappropriate due to WH&S guidelines, for their own and others safety.
Jewellery	<p>Only the following jewellery may be worn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A wristwatch, small gold or silver cross/Christian medallion on a thin chain worn inside the shirt. Smart watches or wearable technology are not permitted at the Mercy Campus. • A plain ring or metal bracelet (no plastic bands) can be worn at the Senior Campus. • Only one pair of small matching earrings – either sleepers or studs – may be worn, with a maximum of one earring in each earlobe. • Confiscated jewellery may be collected at the end of the term. • No other visible piercings are permitted including clear plastic studs. Band-Aids cannot be worn over piercings.
Boys' Appearance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boys are expected to be clean shaven. No facial hair is to be evident.
Tattoos	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tattoos are not to be visible at any time. They are to be covered at all times when wearing the College uniform and at all College-related activities.
Hair	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hair should be generally neat and tidy. Style cuts should be blended. • Students are expected to wear their uniform in a way which reflects pride in the College and their own appearance. Hair styles should be appropriate to this image and more 'eccentric/extreme' styles are not acceptable. • Hair longer than collar length should be tied back (boys and girls). If hair ribbons or small scrunchies are worn they must be the College colours only. • As a guide, the following haircuts/styles are not permitted: dreadlocks; cornrows; mullets; less than gauge two; spiked; undercut; wedge cut; tracks; variations to normal colour (including excessive bleaching).
Make-Up	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Makeup (including tinted lotions), false eyelashes or extensions, coloured acrylic nails and coloured nail varnish are all not permitted.
Non-Uniform Days	<p>Students may come to school in 'free dress' on specified days – Retreat Days, Camps and for some excursions. Guidelines include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Neat and tidy. • Clothing with inappropriate prints/slogans are not permitted. • Immodest clothing (eg. bare midriff) is not permitted. • Shirts and t-shirts must have sleeves – those with shoe-string straps are not permitted. • Appropriate clothing must be worn in all practical classes (eg. sports shoes for PE, closed-in shoes for Science practical, closed-in leather shoes for Technology classes). • Thongs are not permitted. • Students should consider the likely activities undertaken when deciding what to wear. Skirts may not be appropriate for physical activities.
