Fees are charged on a term basis; however, payments may be made by arrangement with the College Finance Office to allow families to meet their commitments by weekly, fortnightly, monthly or quarterly payments. These payment arrangements must be concluded by 23 October 2026. Usually, these payment arrangements are by direct debit from a nominated bank account. Term fees are due two weeks after billing during Week 1 of each Term.

If annual fees, including all levies, are paid in full by 14 February 2026, families will receive a 3% discount.

Explanation of family discounts: to be eligible for a family discount, all students must be from the one family, enrolled at Mary MacKillop Catholic College and all fees charged to the one account holder.

College Fees are charged in chronological order i.e. the eldest child is the 1<sup>st</sup> child. All siblings must be charged to the same account holders to be eligible for the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> child discount.

## Explanation of fees and levies

<p><b>Capital Building Fund Levy</b></p>	<p>To cover repayments of current buildings, construction of future buildings and facilities, and the maintenance program on all other facilities.</p>

<p><b>Device Levy</b></p>	<p>This levy covers the hire of a College owned laptop (7-12) or Surface Go (4-6) for student use.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Laptop (yr 3 – 4) - protective laptop bag, charger, access to Wi-Fi, IT technical support, software, licensing</li> <li>• Surface Go (yr 5 – 6) – protective case with keyboard, charger, access to Wi-Fi, IT technical support, software, licensing</li> <li>• Laptop (yr 7 – 12) – protective laptop bag, charger, access to Wi-Fi, IT technical support, software, licensing</li> </ul>

## Additional Fees

### Annual Fees do not include the following:

- School camps/retreats – as advised by the College (average cost is \$350-\$400)
- Individual or group instrumental lessons
- College Ensembles
- Instrumental Hire
- Costs of representative teams or sports
- Replacement of textbooks, student ID and badges
- Optional courses not covered by VETIS funding
- Calculators, uniforms, Cafe, student stationery, padlocks
- Non QCE qualifications
- External courses, TAFE courses
- Optional: school tours, public performances, valedictory dinner, College formal, senior jersey.

### Please note:

From time to time a student activity/event may arise which may incur an additional charge. Parents will be advised in advance of the details and costs.

## Methods of Payment – College Fees

- Agreed Payment Plan by Direct Debit, Credit Card, or BPay
- EFTPOS – Debit and Credit Cards at the College Administration Office
- Cash at the College Administration Office

## Application and Acceptance of Enrolment Fees

A **non-refundable application** fee of \$50.00 for each student is payable when the student applies for enrolment.

A **non-refundable acceptance** fee of \$200.00 for each student is payable when the student enrolment is accepted by the College.

## Late Fees

A Reminder Notice will be issued to all families who have not settled the school fee account by the due date where an Agreed Payment Plan is not in place.

All Agreed Payment Plans will be arranged to include a regular schedule that will clear the school fee account by the last business day of October. Any extensions to an Agreed Payment Plan must be negotiated with the College Business Manager.

## Concession Information

A fee concession is available for eligible families. This eligibility is available on the basis of a just and equitable formula reflecting financial hardship and is consistent with Toowoomba Catholic Schools Office guidelines.

An Application for Concession on Fees form can be obtained by contacting the College Business Manager. The granting of a fee concession is conditional on the family agreeing to the direct debit method of school fee payment. Fee concessions must be applied for annually.

Under the conditions of an application for concession, families receiving a concession will not be eligible to apply for or attend non-compulsory extra-curricular activities that are offered by the College.

## Bursaries & Scholarships

The College offers a range of scholarships and bursaries to both new and existing families. The following terms apply to Bursaries and Scholarships.

- The Scholarship discounts are applied to the tuition component of the College fees only.
- Those families in receipt of concessions have their scholarships discount applied firstly to their tuition component of the College fees, followed by their concessions.
- Those families who have received existing scholarships will have their scholarship percentages converted to a dollar value which will continue over the term of the existing scholarship.

## Payment of Additional Student Expenses not covered by College Fees

If your child is participating in representative sport, drama or musical performances (e.g. Eisteddfod) or specialist appointments (e.g. Audiologist, Occupational Therapy) payment must be made and received by the College before the date of the activity. Failure to make payment will result in non-participation by the student. We bill these activities at the time the permission slip is sent to families for immediate payment.

## Excursion and Camp Participation

Most class-based excursions and incursions are included within the College fee. Please note, however, the College reserves the right to not offer these experiences to students whose families are in arrears in payments and don't have a College approved payment plan.

## Notification of Withdrawal

Should your circumstances change and your child/ren will not be continuing at the College, we ask for the earliest notice possible. For the purposes of planning and resourcing, we require notification by the final day of the end of the current term.

Notification is defined as the date of the receipt of the Notification of Transfer form. Invoices for fees are sent in the final week of the previous term, and failure to provide this notice will result in one terms' fee being invoiced to you.

Exceptions to this Policy are at the discretion of the Principal. A [Notification of Transfer form](#) must be completed to initiate the cancellation of your child's enrolment at the College.
