Uniform Expectations in Junior School

As we approach the end of the year, we begin thinking of 2022. One of the main changes as we transition through the Junior School year levels is the change in uniform requirements for students.

Parents are reminded that all uniform requirements, with the exception of shoes, must be purchased at the Ormiston College Uniform Shop.

Students entering Year 1 in 2022

Prep Students (Boys and Girls) going into Year 1 are required to wear **velcro black leather formal school shoes**. They will also require predominantly white runners for PE and Sport. Their white PE shoes will need to be packed in their Sports tote bag to change into for Sport on their timetabled day. Year 1 students also require sports socks for PE and Sport as well as a House shirt for Thursday sport and carnival days.



Year 2 Boys going into Year 3 in 2022

The uniform for boys entering Year 3 is a formal uniform change.

Boys in Year 3 to Year 6 have the following formal dress uniform requirements:

- Formal Junior boys' shorts
- Formal Junior boys' shirts
- Junior boys' tie
- Black leather belt (silver buckle)
- Formal boys' knee-high socks and garters
- Formal boys' dress hat



Year 4 Girls going into Year 5 in 2022

The uniform for girls entering Year 5 is a new formal uniform change.

Girls in Year 5 and Year 6 have the following formal dress uniform requirements:

- Junior girls' skirt (length worn at the knee)
- Junior girls' blouse
- Junior girls' tie
- Formal girls' socks
- Junior girls' dress hat



Boys and Girls going into Year 7 in 2022

At Ormiston College, the uniform changes as students enter Year 7 and join the Secondary School. A brief summary is provided below:

Secondary School Boys' School Uniform

- Senior boys' shirts
- Senior boys' tie. Ties form part of the formal boys' uniform, with top button done up and tied (Windsor knot) properly over the top button
- Formal men's trousers (worn at the waist, not on the hips)
- Black leather waist belt (silver buckle)
- Black business (crew length) socks
- Black leather lace-up school shoes (always polished)
- Formal boys' dress hat
- Ormiston College boys' blazer which may be worn at any time throughout the year but **MUST** be worn between home and school each day during Term 2 and Term 3 and as part of the Formal Dress Uniform, when required



Secondary School Girls' School Uniform

- Senior girls' skirt (length worn well below the knee)
- Senior girls' blouse. This must be long enough to sit on the hips and of sufficient size so that the blouse does not ride up during normal movements of arms
- Senior girls' tie
- Formal girls' socks
- Black leather lace-up school shoes (always polished).
- Senior girls' dress hat
- Underwear should be white or natural skin tone in colour. Coloured underwear is visible through the uniform, particularly the white blouse, and is unacceptable
- Ormiston College girls' blazer which may be worn at any time throughout the year but **MUST** be worn between home and school each day during Term 2 and Term 3 and as part of the Formal Dress Uniform, when required



Parents of students in Year 6 who are moving into Year 7 in 2022 are reminded to ensure all uniform items are correct, appropriately hemmed and in good condition.

School Shoes in the Junior School

Prep

School Shoes - Black, Leather, Velcro Joggers

Year 1 to Year 2

School Shoes - Black, Leather, Velcro

Sports Shoes - must be predominantly White

Year 3 to Year 6

School Shoes - Black, Leather, Lace-up

Sports Shoes - must be predominantly White

Hats in the Junior School

Prep to Year 2 - Formal Hat
- Play Hat

Year 3 to Year 6 - Formal Hat
- Sports Cap

Co-curricular Sport in Year 4 to Year 6

Team Uniform (sport specific)

Visor (Tennis or Netball)

Sport Socks / Skins (Soccer, Rugby, Hockey)

Shoes: Sports specific shoes are permitted, for example; Basketball shoes, Athletics shoes

Hair

Girls hair is to be worn in a single low plait. Hair is to be tied back with brown, black, or maroon hair elastic and finished off with a maroon ribbon or maroon scrunchie. The conservative style of a girl's hair must enable her to wear the College Girls Dress Hat appropriately. Girls fringes are to be neat, tidy and not impeding their vision. Girls hair that is shorter than shoulder length must be tied back in a neat single ponytail. Plain design bobby pins or hair slides in brown, black or maroon are to be used to keep hair off the face.



Boys hair must be cut in a conservative College cut. Boys hair is to be neatly brushed or combed. An appropriate length means that the fringe should not be longer than the position of the eyebrows and the hair should not be over the shirt collar at the back. Hair should not be any shorter than a number 3 clipper.
