



# BEHAVIOUR RESOLUTION POLICY

---

## Purpose

Peter Moyes Anglican Community School (the School) promotes values that are in keeping with the Christian ethos. We are an Anglican school that values faith, excellence, compassion, respect, responsibility and courage. These values underpin our behavioural expectations.

School expectations of behaviour are necessary for the mutual protection and benefit of all. The aim is to make the School a safe and enjoyable place in which to teach and learn.

The School's Behaviour Resolution Framework is based on the philosophy of pastoral care, where all members of the School community are respectfully treated with dignity, they feel safe, are aware of their rights and responsibilities. Students are expected to uphold the School values and enhance the reputation of the School and each individual who belongs to the School Community.

Students are expected to be respectful at all times whilst at School, at camps, engaged in School activities in the community, and at all times whilst representing the School.

The School assists students to positively promote demonstration of the School values and self-discipline using the School Behaviour Resolution Process. The five level process, with a severity clause if required, places the onus on students to accept the consequences of their actions and undertake a responsible role in solving the problem created.

The School has a legal requirement to report breaches of community laws to the Police and other government agencies.
