## Preface

At Peter Moyes Anglican Community School, we acknowledge the pivotal role that digital and online technology play as dynamic tools for effective education and meaningful social interactions within our community. In alignment with our commitment to excellence, the School's Information and Communication Technology (ICT) philosophy endeavours to cultivate responsible and ethical technology usage, fostering a secure and inclusive digital learning environment for all students.

The School has a 1-1 laptop programme for students from Years 3 to 12. The Notebook and associated technologies offer valuable learning opportunities for all students. Students use their device, referred to as a notebook, daily at School. Students from Years 3 to 10 have a School-owned device which is leased to the student for a four-year period. Students in Year 11 and 12 purchase their device from a list of preferred options and through the School's nominated provider.

The School provides ICT resources exclusively for educational purposes. Our ICT network is a designated platform for students to engage in research, study and communication. To ensure the responsible use of this resource, students are expected to adhere to the School's procedures and guidelines. Students must make their device available to staff when requested for reasons which may include checking work, installing software, and/or checking internet usage history.

It is important for students to have a clear understanding of its expectations of how digital and online technology should be used to contribute to a positive and constructive digital learning environment. We hold our students to a high standard of conduct and believe that students should not behave in a manner that would negatively affect or bring into disrepute the reputation of the School. The School also recognises that the misuse of digital and online technology and environments can cause both damage to the School's reputation and seriously affect the welfare of its students. In some cases it can also be grounds for criminal charges.

The School reserves the right to apply all sanctions and implement such procedures as it considers necessary in the resolution of alleged breaches of this policy and the associated student IT Guidelines.
