



PARENTS' & FRIENDS' ASSOCIATION POLICY

Purpose

Peter Moyes Anglican Community School (the School) values the Parents' and Friends' Association (P&F) in the life of the School. It aims to further the educational, social and financial interests of the School, through liaison with the School Council and the Principal. It also aids with School activities, together with the raising and expenditure of funds.

The membership of the P&F is open to all parents/guardians, fee payers of children attending the School and adult persons who can satisfy the Association that they have a bona fide interest in furthering the objectives of the Association, such as past students.

The P&F is managed by a Committee consisting of the Executive, made up of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer the School Principal/representative (ex-officio member) and from four to 10 General Committee members.

All Committee positions are open for election at the Association's Annual General Meeting. The Committee is divided into sub-committees, consisting of one or more Committee members, responsible for co-ordination of activities. Examples of sub committees include Fundraising and Social activities.

Committee meetings are held throughout the year. All members are welcome to attend. Dates of meetings are published via the School App and on the School website. Copies of the Association's Constitution are available from Main Administration.

Every child's enrolment at the School includes an annual Levy of \$30 to the P&F. The money raised by the Levy and any additional fundraising is used to improve resources available to all students within the School.

Over the year parents/guardians are encouraged to volunteer their time to help within the School community. Parents/guardians can choose to provide services to the School in areas such as assisting teachers, fundraising and social events.
