



STUDENT UNIFORM POLICY

Peter Moyes Anglican Community School (the School) expects all students come to School each day in correct uniform. Correct uniform must also be worn when travelling to and from School. The School Uniform is available from the School Uniform Shop.

Students and families should be familiar with the School Uniform Guidelines, which details all aspects of the School's expectations and the hours of operation of the School Uniform Shop.

In brief, there are variations of the School Uniform for Primary students in PK to Year 6 and Secondary students in Years 7 to 12, in summer and winter terms, for sporting activities and when students are formally representing the School. Students must adhere to the expectations of wearing the correct School Uniform to, from and within the School grounds, and to external School events.

Winter Uniform is worn in Terms 2 and 3. Summer Uniform is worn in Terms 1 and 4. At Formal functions the Winter Uniform is worn by students in Years 7 to 12 and includes the School Blazer. For girls, formal wear includes stockings.

Footwear should be kept in a good, clean condition, providing adequate support and protection. All shoes must be worn in accordance with the School's guidelines. Socks must be worn at appropriate height, that is above the ankle bone and below the calf. The transition for all students wearing French Navy socks throughout the year (with the option of girls wearing navy/black tights in Terms 2 & 3) comes into effect Term 2, 2026. The Student Uniform stipulates the manner in which the School jumper and blazer should be worn. Shirts are to be tucked in at all times. Skirts and dresses should be long enough to meet the top of the knee. Underwear should not be visible through or under the School Uniform.

The Student Uniform incorporates a variety of items, including the School sun hat, scarf, blazer, Leavers Jacket, sports uniform and waterproof jacket. Students should adhere to the conventions of where, when and how these items are to be worn. Non-uniform day dress standards are specific and reflect the high expectations of the School.

Students must meet the requirement that their dress and personal appearance reflect the high standards expected. This is of particular importance when students are seen in the School Uniform in the wider community. The Student Uniform Guidelines outline the requirements of personal appearance of all students in terms of hair, nails, makeup, facial hair, piercings, tattoos, jewellery.

Any student whose appearance is contrary to the dress and personal grooming expectations may be sent home, under direction of the Dean of Students until such time as their appearance meets expectations and assurances have been received from the student and their parents/guardians, that appropriate dress and grooming will be maintained in the future.

The Principal's discretion and decision as to whether a student's uniform and/or appearance is acceptable is absolute.
