The Queensland Certificate of Education comprises a two-year course of study, 4 semesters, over Years 11 and 12. In certain circumstances, students choose to complete the course over a three-year period. Based on the documentation provided regarding the student's previous studies, the College makes the decision about which semester to enter a student who is transferring into Queensland senior studies. If you are planning to transfer to Queensland from interstate or overseas you, or your school, should provide the principal with school reports and certificates as evidence of your previous schooling.

At the end of Year 12 students who meet the necessary requirements receive a Student Education Profile that comprises a: Senior Statement Queensland Certificate of Education Tertiary Entrance Statement (ATAR - if applicable).

Queensland Certificate of Education: Subject results on the Queensland Certificate of Education will be reported as a grade A - E. Results for vocational education and training units of competency and modules are reported according to nationally endorsed competency standards.

Tertiary Entrance Statement from 2020: The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a fine-grained rank order between 0.00 and 99.95 with increments of 0.05. In the new system of tertiary entrance, eligibility for an ATAR will require satisfactory completion of a QCAA English subject.

SPORTING OPPORTUNITIES:

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FEES

Tuition Fees

The annual Course Fee is the fee the College receives that is related directly to the provision of the course in which a student is enrolled, and it is usual for the annual Course Fee to increase each year by approximately 3%. The fees for Rivermount College are set by the College Board of Directors and are reviewed annually.

The annual Course Fee includes the cost of any compulsory course materials or books supplied by the College. It also includes the compulsory 1 to 1 Laptop Program Fee for students in Year 7 to 12.

The Tuition Fee includes all the services that are commonly provided for the students at a particular year level or subject (including subject levies, excursions, social events, camps, et cetera that are deemed to be part of the curricular and co-curricular experience).

Non-tuition Fees

Non-Tuition Fees include the once only Application Fee and the once only Confirmation of Enrolment Fee. The Non-tuition Fee component also includes amounts required to be paid for Overseas Student Health Cover, uniforms, books purchased by the student, and any Queensland Studies Authority fees.

Optional Fees

(Not Included in Total Course Cost Calculation)

Optional Fees will only be added to your account after your permission has been sought and received. These fees are the costs that may be incurred by a student if they choose to participate in additional programmes including the Performing Arts Tuition Program (including visiting tutors and optional private performing arts tuition (Cheerleading, Dance and other activities offered by the College that are levied in addition to the Tuition and Non-Tuition component.

Important Notes regarding Fees:

- The Application Fee is payable once upon enrolment and is non-refundable
- The Confirmation Fee is payable once upon acceptance of an offer of enrolment and is non-refundable.
- Published Fees are subject to annual review and may change. If the tuition fees are increased you will be required to pay the new fees as they are introduced
- There are Two (2) Semesters per year: 1 Semester = 1 Study Period
- Note: In cases of visa refusal, the Confirmation Fee will form part of any refund calculation. Please refer to the 'Visa Refusal' section of the College Refund Policy.
- Full Fee Paying Overseas Students shall incur a minimum charge of one (1) Term's Tuition fee charged irrespective of start date
- There are no charges of subject levies, base level compulsory school camps or excursions
- Overseas Health Insurance is required for the duration of the student visa
- Queensland Studies Authority (QSA) Charges are applicable to students in Years 11 and 12 only
- Uniforms are compulsory and an approximate fee is shown
- Stationary is a requirement and an approximate fee per annum is shown

HOW TO ENROL

Rivermount College will consider enrolment applications from students wishing to apply for a Student Visa, subject to compliance with minimum requirements and conditions set by the College, and with legislative requirements of the State of Queensland and the Commonwealth of Australia, including any requirements to undertake extra tuition to learn English to meet the English language proficiency standard needed to enter mainstream classes.

Applications for enrolment must be made on the College Application Form and accompanied by required supporting documentation including:

- School Reports
- Birth Certificate
- Passport
- and evidence of medical, learning or legal documentation if applicable

Where the above documents are not in English, certified translations in English are required, with necessary costs to be met by the applicant.

An application for enrolment can only be processed when all of the above are received by the Director of Enrolments and Marketing.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

We require all students entering the College to have a good knowledge of English. Students for whom English is a second language are required to produce the results of proficiency rating tests as detailed below:

1. Students must provide evidence of satisfactory academic performance appropriate to entry to the Year level requested on the Application for Enrolment or offered as an alternative point of entry by the school in a Letter of Offer.

- a) For Primary School:
 - i) Evidence of application to schoolwork and age-appropriate achievement in literacy and numeracy areas of the curriculum
- b) For Year 7 – 12 students:
 - i) A pass level or “C” Year Level or better for the majority of core subjects

English Language Proficiency Requirements

- Applicants are assessed individually based on the contents of their report cards and personal references, and may also be required to undertake a language proficiency test set by the school.
- If supplied, Rivermount College will assess evidence of English language proficiency presented by a student at the time of application, but reserves the right to confirm the student’s English language proficiency through additional tests.

If not presenting appropriate evidence of English language proficiency at the time of application, Rivermount College will assess the student’s application for entry based on satisfactory test results as follows:

Acceptable Test	Minimum Test Result	For Entry to
TOEFL	550	Year 10 to Year 12
IELTS	5.5	Year 10 to Year 12
ISLPR	2+	Year 10 to Year 12

Students should note that if their language proficiency is below that outlined above, they may be required to undertake an intensive English language course before beginning mainstream studies.

In Australia, if there's a life-threatening emergency, call 000 (zero zero zero). This is always a free call, even from your mobile. An operator will answer and will ask which of the following services you need:

Police

Fire

Ambulance

If you're not sure which one you need just tell the operator what you are calling about and they will help guide you. If you don't speak English, tell the operator your language and you will be connected to a translator who will be able to assist.

It is important to remain calm. The operator will ask questions, such as: where are you located, what is the emergency, and how many people are involved.

If it's a life-threatening emergency, you should call 000 even if you are at school or on campus.
