B4@SHC is a safe and supportive environment where everyone is welcome.

At B4@SHC we look after each other and we look after the space together.

All activities and excursions with B4@SHC are free of charge for everyone.

Our B4 Staff plan different activities for each week and have everything set up for when families arrive. B4 Staff are on hand to provide guidance and support for children, parents and caregivers throughout each session.

Parents and caregivers always supervise their child/ren and must be able to always see and hear their child/ren.

Activities are set up for children and their parents/caregivers to play together. When children and their parents/caregivers have finished at an activity, they re-set the activity ready for the next group to enjoy.

If parents, caregivers or children are feeling unwell, they stay at home.

B4 Staff are available to support parents and caregivers in their understanding of child development and how to respond to child/ren's interests, strengths and needs.

B4 Staff can support families in providing resources and ideas to support learning in the home setting.
