Tuition Fees and Year Group Levies

St Mark's Anglican Community School, part of AngliSchools, is a non-profit organisation. Tuition Fees are the minimum possible to provide the difference between income provided by way of Commonwealth and State grants and the essential expenditure of teaching, administration and facility update and maintenance. Year group levies are other fees and charges that are applicable to all students in a year group.

Year Group Levies relate to the School's compulsory curriculum, activities and camps, which the School expects students to attend and participate in. Charges included in the Year Group Levy are non-refundable if a student is unable to attend. Items included in a Year Group Levy include, but are not limited to:

- **Books, resources, consumables and online subscriptions:** These items may be sourced by the School (rather than families) where it is more straightforward or cost effective to do so. The cost of these items is on-charged to families. Estimates of costs may be advised in subject selection booklets, booklists or via communication from Heads of Department. Items which may be purchased from the booklist program are not included in Year Group Levies.
- **Technology and leased device charges:** This charge is for providing one-to-one personal computing facilities for Year 2 to Year 12 students, either through the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program or through School provision. Fees in 2026 range from \$240 per annum where a device is provided in Year 2, \$535 per annum where a device is provided in Year 3 and Year 4, \$680 per annum for a device provided in Year 5, \$640 per annum for a device provided in Year 6, \$685 per annum for a device provided in Year 7 and Year 8 and \$130 per annum for BYOD students in Year 9 to Year 12. Details of the provision of devices for students is provided at enrolment.
- **Excursions, Incursions, Activities and Camps:** Compulsory events that apply to all students in a year group are included in the Year Group Levy and are charged based on cost estimates. Examples may include swimming lessons, Year 5 camp, and Year 9 or 10 Outdoor Adventure Studies camps.
- **House Carnivals** include Year 6 to 12 House swimming, cross country and athletics events and they are charged based on cost estimates.

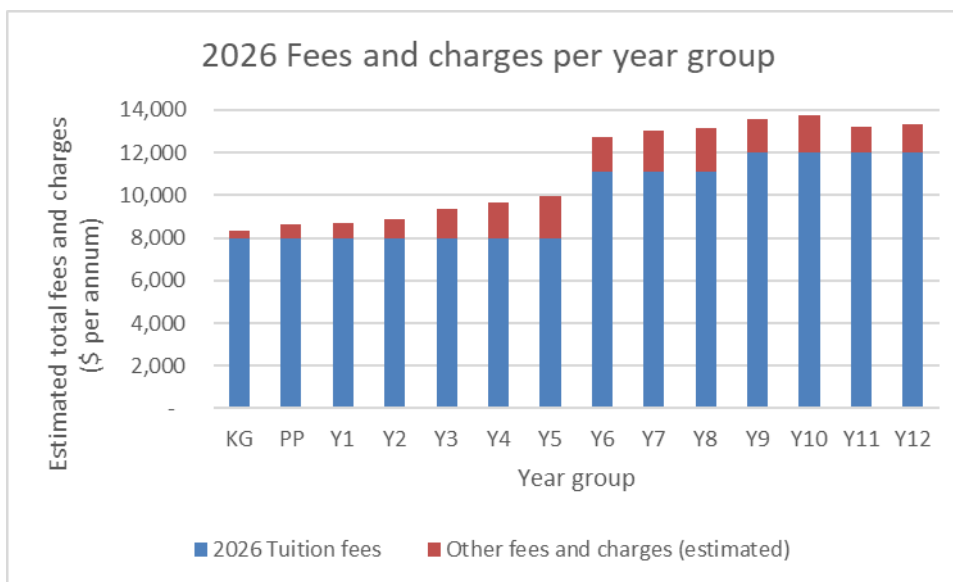

St Mark's adopts a "user pays" principle in applying identifiable costs to family accounts. Fees and charges in addition to tuition fees can be reasonably estimated for Kindergarten to Year 7, while subject selection in Year 8 and onwards will impact the fees and charges applicable. An estimate of total fees and charges for a typical student in each year group is detailed in the chart below.

Please note that the estimate should be used as a guide only. It does not include any sibling discount or charges for optional extras such as music fees/levies, CareerLink, Curtin UniReady, Certificate II and III studies and optional tours. It includes an average value for subject levies and costs; however, these costs may vary significantly in Senior School due to specific subject selection.



Sibling Discount

A sibling discount of 20% of tuition fees applies to each member of the family concurrently attending the School, other than the eldest student. Sibling discounts do not apply to year group levies, subject charges or other charges.

Subject Charges

Subject Charges are charges that are applicable to all students in an elective subject. The charges relate to the subject's curriculum and activities and are non-refundable if a student is unable to attend. Items included in a Subject Charge may include, but are not limited to:

- **Books, resources, consumables and online subscriptions:** These items may be sourced by the School (rather than families) where it is more straightforward or cost effective to do so. The cost of these items is on-charged to families. Estimates of costs may be advised in subject selection booklets, booklists or via communication from Heads of Department.
- **Excursions, Incursions, Activities and Camps:** Compulsory events that apply to all students in an elective subject are included in a Subject Charge and are charged based on cost estimates. Examples may include sailing for Marine and Maritime Studies, Year 11 Outdoor Education expedition and Year 10 Mandarin excursion.
- **VET, CareerLink, and Certificate II and III courses:** Costs vary depending on the training provider and the course undertaken. Some courses are provided free of charge, while others can cost up to \$3,000. Details of relevant course costs may be obtained from the Head of Futures or in the subject selection booklet.

Other Charges

OT and Speech screening charge of \$80 for students new to St Mark's in Pre-Primary or Year 1.

Halogen Conference charge of \$70 for Middle School Leaders.

Parents and Friends' Association ("P&F") Membership Subscription charged and collected on behalf of the P&F and which has been set for 2026 by the P&F at \$60 per annum. All parents and guardians of enrolled students are members of the P&F. The membership subscription will be charged to the oldest enrolled sibling. The School will pass the full P&F Membership Subscription to the P&F for use in accordance with the Rules of the P&F to support the School community.

Community Participation Program Levy will be charged to families who do not complete the 10 commitment hours required by the School in 2026. The levy of \$330 (GST does not apply) will be charged by the School at the commencement of 2027. This levy will be donated in full to the P&F as a contribution toward financing community aspects of the School.

Old Scholars' Association ("OSA") Levy of \$25 per student, to a maximum of \$50 per family. The school will pass the full OSA Levy to the OSA for use in accordance with the OSA's Constitution for OSA initiatives within both the School and the wider St Mark's community.

Music Tuition is available to students for instrumental and vocal lessons. Students enrolled in lessons will be allocated a music tutor. Music tuition fees will not be included on school fee accounts. Music tuition fees will be invoiced by, and payable directly to, the music tutor. Music tutors will charge (excluding GST) \$44.15 per 30-minute individual music lesson, \$58.90 per 40-minute individual music lesson or \$31.30 per student per 40-minute shared music lesson.

Music Amenities Levy of \$155 per annum for students enrolled in instrumental or vocal music lessons or participating in instrumental ensembles. This levy is for the provision of amenities for performances, ensembles, facilities and music diaries supplied by the School. To ensure the School can plan, allocate appropriate music tutors and organise meaningful ensembles and performances, the School requires an annual commitment to the Music program. This levy is non-refundable in the event of withdrawal from music lessons or ensembles during the year. The levy does not apply to students only enrolled in the Year 2 Strings or Year 5 Band programs.

Year 5 Band Program fee of \$600 per student enrolled in the Year 5 Band Program. This fee covers band tuition, musical instrument hire and a music diary. To ensure the School can plan, allocate appropriate music tutors and organise meaningful performances, the School requires an annual commitment to this program. This fee is non-refundable in the event of withdrawal from the band program during the year.

Musical instrument hire is available from the School for most orchestral instruments at a cost of \$255 per annum. This hire fee does not apply to students only enrolled in the Year 2 Strings or Year 5 Band programs.

Issuing and Payment of Accounts

Annual accounts are emailed to the account holder's nominated email address at the commencement of each school year. Families may select a payment method from one of the standard payment options that best suit their family needs. Standard payment options are:

- Annual – one instalment due on 17 February 2026,
- Quarterly – four instalments due on 17 February 2026, 5 May 2026, 4 August 2026 and 27 October 2026,
- Monthly – ten instalments on the 25th of each month from February to November 2026 (inclusive), or
- Fortnightly – twenty instalments commencing on 20 February 2026 and ending on 13 November 2026.

Payment methods available vary for each standard payment option and are:

A Payment Option Nomination must be completed by each family to advise the standard payment option they select for 2026. Families nominating a payment frequency of monthly or fortnightly must authorise the School to debit payments from the family’s nominated bank or credit card account. A 1% surcharge applies to credit card payments. No discounts are offered for early payment. Cash payments are not accepted.

Every endeavour will be made to include all fees and charges on accounts at the commencement of the year; however, there may be additional charges billed during the year. This may include ad hoc charges that arise during the year or where applicable students are not yet confirmed, such as music ensemble activities and other optional activities. Account adjustments will also be issued where students change elective subjects and subject charges are applicable.

Overdue Accounts

Where an amount is not paid by the due date, and no arrangements have been made, the School reserves the right to charge an additional \$22 penalty. Liability for the payment of fees is a joint and several responsibility of the Enrolment Agreement signatories who shall further be responsible for any costs associated with the collection of any unpaid fees, including legal costs on an indemnity basis.

Parents experiencing difficulties in meeting the standard payment options must discuss alternative arrangements with the Business Manager in confidence. The School offers a Tuition Fee Assistance Plan for families experiencing financial difficulties due to unforeseen personal and economic circumstances. Students benefiting from Tuition Fee Assistance may be ineligible to undertake optional programs that incur a charge, such as tours, music tuition, CareerLink and Cert II/III courses.

The Principal reserves the right to refuse a student to commence a new term unless school fee payments are in accordance with a standard payment option or satisfactory payment arrangements have been made with the [Business Manager](#).

Optional Tours

Optional tours may include overseas, interstate and intrastate destinations, such as the ski trip, Parnngurr tour, Coral Bay Marine Tour, sporting trips (e.g. netball and volleyball), Music tour, Language tour, etc. Family fee accounts must comply with a standard payment option and be up to date for students to be eligible to attend optional tours involving significant expense. That is, from the time of nominating a student for a tour, all payment amounts due as per the school’s standard payment options must have been received by the School. Families must continue to meet payment due dates up until the end of the year in which the tour occurs. Students will not be permitted to attend optional tours if family fees and tour fees are overdue or a non-standard payment option has been arranged. Any cancellation costs associated with the late withdrawal of a student due to non-payment of fees will be charged to the respective family account.

The School’s policy also provides that students benefiting from fee remission cannot attend optional tours.

GST (Goods and Services Tax)

GST legislation provides that tuition fees incurred in education courses are GST free; however, there are some activities and expenses that attract GST. These will be included in your fee account as appropriate.

Application Fee

A non-refundable fee of \$50 (including GST) per child is payable with the Enrolment Application. This fee will be retained by the School and applied to the administration costs associated with enrolments.

Enrolment Deposit

A non-refundable Enrolment Deposit, representing a family's commitment to take up an offered position, will be charged except where the family already has, or has had, a child attending the School and a full Enrolment Deposit has already been paid. This Enrolment Deposit **is not** deducted from future tuition fees. The 2026 Enrolment Deposit is \$2,780. A pro rata Enrolment Deposit is calculated for students commencing in Years 9 to 12 (80% for Year 9, 60% for Year 10, 40% for Year 11 and 20% for Year 12). Payment of the Enrolment Deposit and submission of the required enrolment documentation shall guarantee enrolment of the child(ren) being offered a place at the time and does not guarantee acceptance of subsequent applications. Enrolment fees **are not** refundable.

Withdrawal of Students

One full term's notice of withdrawal from the School is required in writing to the Principal. In the event of failure to give such notice, the equivalent of a term's fee is payable in lieu. Notification of withdrawal can be emailed to principal@stmarks.wa.edu.au

Tax Deductible Building Fund Contributions

The School welcomes voluntary donations to the Building Fund maintained by AngliSchools. AngliSchools will pass on 100% of the funds specifically donated for St Mark's to maintain and extend the St Mark's facilities in the future. The Fund is approved by the Australian Taxation Office, and all donations over \$2 are eligible tax deductions. Enquiries should be made to the [Business Manager](#).

Booklists

Books and other resources not provided by the School may be purchased by families directly through the annual booklist program, currently through Campion Education. The School receives a rebate on family purchases from the booklist. 2026 Booklists are published on the [School website](#).

Uniforms

Uniforms should be purchased at the School Uniform Shop to preserve uniformity in the articles worn by all students. Uniform Shop opening hours and prices are published on the [School website](#).

Insurance

It is strongly recommended that parents check their health and general insurance policies to ensure adequate and current medical, personal property and liability insurance cover is in place. The School will not accept responsibility for medical expenses (including ambulance costs) arising from accident or illness, loss of or damage to personal effects and property, or liability incurred by students for bodily injury or property damage.

The School provides a Student Accident Insurance policy for limited cover 24 hours a day, seven days a week for every student attending the School. The policy is partially funded by the Parents and Friends' Association. The policy includes a fee relief benefit, which provides a limited payment for school tuition fees in the event of the death of a student's parent or guardian as a result of injury or specified sickness.
