The St Mark's Old Scholars' Association provides a means for past students to maintain a link with their School and friends.

The Association runs its own monthly meetings and social functions. New events are planned each year

The Committee also offers practical support for the volunteers who arrange their year group's reunions.

A **OSA Playgroup** offers the opportunity for Old Scholar mums and dads (or partners of Old Scholars) to connect with one another.

Old Scholars can also apply to become tutors through the '**Study with Old Scholars**' project.

Association members also have the opportunity to support School activities and are a valuable source of **guest speakers** for events, Assemblies and House meetings.

The Association has a representative on the **School Council**. This role provides the Association with the opportunity to provide feedback to the administrators and Principal.

The Association introduced a new Business Networking group for Old Scholars who own their own business. The meetings are held once a quarter - check the website and Facebook page for upcoming events.

Who can become a member?

Any person who attended St Mark's as a student for not less than one year when studying Years 10, 11 and 12 or via application to the St Marks Old Scholars Association Committee for discretionary approval.

Students who graduated from St Mark's after 2008 were automatically transferred as members through the lifetime membership fee added to final school accounts.
