1 Introduction

Sophia Mundi Steiner School offers a range of scholarships to celebrate aspiration and achievement, and to foster access and diversity.

Our scholarships seek to recognise the capabilities of talented students and are specifically aimed at widening access to the exceptional education provided by Sophia Mundi Steiner school and the International Baccalaureate diploma program.

This Scholarship program supersedes previous SMSS scholarship programs. Students enrolled at SMSS under earlier scholarship programs retain the terms and conditions of that program.

2 Annual scholarships Year 10 and 11 entry

Annual Scholarships applications are available to any student entering Year 10 and 11 in the following year. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of student merit as measured by a third-party test, an interview, community and cultural involvement and past school reports.

We offer:

- Academic Scholarships (75% or 50% of tuition fees). All other costs are not covered by scholarship.
- Music Scholarships - All applicants must first register for an Academic Scholarship and then applicants register for a Music Scholarships (100% of tuition fees). All other costs are not covered by

scholarship.

Any student is invited to apply for these scholarships whether they are already enrolled at the School or new students.

3 Annual scholarships Year 7 to 9 entry

Annual Scholarships applications are available to any student entering Year 7, 8 or 9 in the following year. The number of available scholarships is determined by the Board of Directors.

Any student is invited to apply for a scholarship whether they are already enrolled at the School or new students. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of student merit as measured by an aptitude test, an interview, community and cultural involvement and past school reports indicating academic and behavioural standards.

4 Scholarship specifications

- Scholarships come in the form of remission of tuition fees.
- The value of each Scholarship may vary.
- The school reserves the right to withhold a Scholarship if there are no candidates of sufficient merit.
- There are limited scholarship placements available.

The year level, selection procedures and timings for Scholarships varies, as does the level of support provided. Applications for scholarships can be made at any time during term the year prior to entry.

5 Scholarship application process

Step one – Application process

Interested students/families request a Scholarship application form in the year prior entering the school.

Students are sent an application form (Appendix A) which must be completed by the designated date. Applications received after the submission date will not be considered.

Depending on the scholarship, the school may also ask for supporting documents or other information.

Please note, in addition to the application and enrolment fees an additional non-refundable fee of \$140 is payable with the scholarship application. This is applicable for internal and external applicants.

UNPAID applicants will not be considered for a scholarship.

Step two - Shortlisting

Applications are reviewed by the school and applicants shortlisted.

Applicants taking a scholarship test at Sophia Mundi before entering Year 10 will sit it in Year 9; and students entering Year 11 sit it in Year 10 and so on.

All applicants must sit the scholarship test on specific dates selected by the school.

For families located regionally, interstate or overseas, alternative arrangements may be organised. Contact the enrolments officer for further information.

Please note, the school does not disclose the scholarship testing results and the results remain the property of the school.

Step three – Interview and offer.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with the Principal and/or their delegates. Successful applicants are notified soon after the interview.

Music scholarship applicants are invited to a music performance audition. Applicants must perform two contrasting pieces. Non-pianists must perform at least one piece with piano accompaniment. Candidates will be asked to take sight reading and aural tests, and technical work may be requested.

Step four - Acceptance of offer

One week after offer - To secure a scholarship, families must submit formal enrolment documentation and pay an enrolment fee within 7 school days of receipt of the scholarship offer.

Applications close after the final test date for each year. Late applications will not be accepted.

Scholarship places are limited as there are multiple application dates and places may be filled before the final advertised date.

6 Test Information

Our staff aim to provide a testing day that offers students a supportive and inclusive experience. Our focus is on cultivating a positive atmosphere to minimize stress and enhance the performance of all participants.

Tests are designed to objectively measure skills and attributes that relate to academic performance.

The tests require students to demonstrate a range of skills such as the ability to interpret, infer, deduce and think critically. They are not curriculum based and do not test the ability to retrieve learned knowledge.

Students are assessed in:

- Written expression 1
- Humanities - Comprehension and interpretation
- Mathematics and Science
- Written expression 2

Each task is around 30-45 minutes duration.

These tasks measure how a student performs in relation to the cohort sitting the exam.

Students and parents need to be aware that these tests maybe demanding and that not all students will complete each test within the time allowed. It is important students do not spend too much time

on questions they find too difficult.

Test are conducted under exam conditions. No papers or books are permitted. Apple or smart watches / phones / fit bits or any other devices are not permitted in the test room.

Students are required to bring pens and pencils, and a transparent water bottle.

Who decides the awarding and duration of scholarships?

The school is the sole decision maker. A student's academic ability is one of multiple factors taken into account. Once awarded, the scholarship benefit is typically provided to the recipient until the end of Year 12 subject to annual review conditions.

Scholarships are subject to an annual formal review to check on progress, performance, and attitude of the recipient. The review criteria include:

- A minimum of 90% attendance
- Internal assessments maintain a 5-point average with no grade lower than 4 in any one subject.
- No suspensions or behaviour action plans recorded during the school year.
- Music scholarship recipients must participate in all music concert events.
- Expectation of being a good role model for other students - such as being a conscientious learner, handing in all required work by the due date, maintaining a positive attitude about studying at Sophia Mundi, proactively supporting school events and open days / tours and encouraging student participation in school events.

ACER: Testing dates

- Internal testing takes place at SMSS prospective date are early term 2, early term 3, early term 4.
- Other testing dates may be available at the principal's discretion.

Note: the school reserves the right to use external testing in place of or in addition to internal testing without notice.

Maximum Number of scholarships each year:

- 2 x 100% Music and academic scholarships
- 2 x 75% scholarships
- 2 x 50% scholarships

It should be noted, scholarships are awarded on merit. If applicants are deemed not to meet awarding standards, then some or none of the scholarship places will be awarded that year. Additionally, holders of Scholarships can normally expect the Scholarship to continue until the end of Class 12 (or whatever other period for which the Scholarships have initially been offered).

Music Scholarships

Music scholarships may be awarded to students entering Year 10 and 11 who demonstrate excellence in music knowledge and musical performance.

For entry into year 10 and 11 at Sophia Mundi.

Music scholarship applicants are required to sit the scholarship test. Shortlisted students are invited to audition at Sophia Mundi.

At the audition, applicants must perform two contrasting pieces. Candidates will be asked to take sight reading and aural tests, and technical work may be requested. Non-pianists must perform at least one piece with piano accompaniment. If piano accompaniment is required for the audition pieces, families are required to arrange external piano accompanists.

Minimum AMEB level (or equivalent) at the time of application is Grade 6 AMEB for instrumental/vocal performance and Grade 4 music theory.

Medical conditions and taking medications during the examination.

All staff at the test are trained in first aid or the administration of life-saving medication such as Epipens, Anapens, asthma inhalers or diabetes devices, so parents must disclose information about medical conditions and medication to the school well before the examination.

Parents may be required to wait near the test venue/s during the examination to administer medication if necessary.

7 Termination of Scholarship

A scholarship may be cancelled if:

- the recipient’s behaviour and/or progress is considered to be unsatisfactory.
- the recipient is suspended or excluded from School.
- Failure to pay fees during the life of the scholarship.
- Failure to pay enrolment, or scholarship testing fees before the awarding of the scholarship.
- the student leaves the School.
