

HARVARD (AUTHOR/DATE) REFERENCING SYSTEM YEAR 10 TASK

Q. WHY DO YOU NEED TO REFERENCE?

A. TO SHOW YOUR TEACHER WHERE YOU CONDUCTED YOUR RESEARCH.

It is important that you always acknowledge another author's work when preparing an Assignment. The reference you provide becomes the link between how you have conducted your research and what you have written. It shows your teacher the resources you have used, for example books, webpages, magazines, images and newspaper articles.

The reference list is at the end of your assignment, and is in alphabetical order.

THE BASIC ELEMENTS OF HARVARD REFERENCING REQUIRED FOR A REFERENCE LIST:

- Author's last name, and initial(s)
- Year of publication,
- *Title*, – in italics
- Edition, if not the first one - use edn
- Publisher,
- Place of Publication.
