



International Student - Living costs within Australia

School Fees

Please refer to the Schedule of Fees - International that is issued each year and on the Toorak College Website. This document outlines all fees related to tuition and boarding.

Other Costs & Living Expenses – Boarding Students

ITEM	COST (All costs are approximate and dependent on the individual student spending behaviours)
Uniform Summer & Winter	\$1500
Textbooks	\$400 - \$600 per year
Stationary	\$150 per year
Health Cover	\$500 per year
Mobile Phone plan	\$30/month
Public Transport	\$40/month
Miscellaneous Items such as snacks, haircuts, clothes and entertainment	\$200 – 400/ month
Flights home	\$1000 - \$2000 per term

Other Costs & Living Expenses – Non-Boarding Students

ITEM	COST (All costs are approximate)
Uniform Summer & Winter	\$1500
Textbooks	\$400 - \$600 per year
Stationary	\$150 per year
Health Cover	\$500 per year
Mobile Phone plan	\$30 per month
Public Transport	\$80 per month
Miscellaneous Items such as snacks, haircuts, clothes and entertainment	\$200 – 400 per month
Flights home	\$1000 - \$2000 per term
Rent	\$2000 - \$4000 per month (Average rent in surrounding area to Toorak College)
Utilities (Water, gas, electricity, Internet etc)	\$200 – \$700 per month
Food	\$500 per month



Accommodation Options

For International Students that are not living with a parent, relative of person approved by the Department of Home Affairs they are required to board within Joan Ansett Hall on the grounds of Toorak College. These boarding fees are outline in the Schedule of Fees - International issued each year by the college.

For International Students that are living with a parent, relative or person approved by the department of Home Affairs there are a number of accommodation options available in the local area. When first arriving in Australia it is recommended that the student along with their family or approved person by the Department of Home Affairs reside near the College in temporary accommodation such as Quest Serviced apartments or hotels so that the student and their family / approved person can become familiar with the surrounding area. It is then recommended that the family member/ approved person rent suitable accommodation close to the College through a registered Real Estate Agent.
