

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This document contains only specific terms and conditions and is not intended to be a comprehensive guide. It should be read in conjunction with the Enrolment Form and the General Conditions and Privacy Policy.

The first payment is payable by **1 March 2025** with final payment due **1 October 2025**.

One term's notice in writing must be given prior to the removal of an enrolled student, otherwise a full term's Tuition Fee will be charged.

The College's policy is that one account is issued to the family who signed the enrolment contract and families are expected to make their own private arrangements for payment. A family member is not able to 'remove' themselves from the enrolment contract without the College's and the other signatory's consent.

PARENTS NEW TO THE COLLEGE

There are two charges that are payable when you commence your inquiries with the College:

- **Application Fee** – a non-refundable fee of \$150 inclusive of GST is payable on submission of your online application.
- **Enrolment Fee** – payable upon acceptance of a place at the College. The enrolment fee assists with bursary support for students otherwise unable to access a Trinity College education. The enrolment fee is non-refundable and non-transferable. The enrolment fee for the first son entering the College is \$2,630. Thereafter, the fee for siblings entering the College is \$1,315.



FEE COLLECTION

The College finances rely on the prompt payment of fees. Fees will be advised at the commencement of each year with a number of payment options available. Details will be included in the Annual Fees Notification advice.

The College is supportive of families who find themselves in difficult circumstances and early contact should be made with the College Business Manager to discuss available options for assistance.

Out of respect for the many families who pay their College fees regularly and on time, the College will rigorously follow up all overdue school fee accounts. In cases where reminder notices are persistently ignored or arrangements to meet the arrears are not met, the accounts will be referred for legal action to recover the amount outstanding.

Any expenses, costs or disbursements incurred by the College in recovering any outstanding monies, including debt collection agency fees and solicitor's costs on an indemnity basis, will be charged to the account.

Students are not eligible to attend College tours and elective camps where fees are overdue and when payment arrangements have not been made with the Business Manager and adhered to.

Please note that special payment arrangements cannot be assumed as continuing and must be re-negotiated with the Business Manager by **1 March 2025**. The final payment is expected by **1 October 2025** unless prior arrangements have been made.

Any account remaining outstanding after **1 October 2025** may be referred to our debt management agency. You will be liable for all management and legal fees incurred as a result of debt recovery actions.

2025 Fees & Charges

COLLEGE FEES 2025

Trinity College continues to offer an affordable Catholic education in the Edmund Rice Tradition. In 2025, with support of the College Advisory Council and Edmund Rice Education Australia, the College has determined the annual College Fees and Charges as detailed below. In determining the fees we have been very mindful of the impact of any necessary increases on families.

College fees consist of a Tuition Fee, Resource Fee and a Technology Levy. The Tuition Fee contributes funds towards the curriculum costs, staff salaries, facility maintenance and some capital expenses. The Tuition Fee has been determined following consideration of Government funding budgeted to be received in 2025.

The Resource Fee assists the funding of camps, retreats, transport, excursions and other resources.

The Technology Levy of \$520 per annum, per student, is charged to help fund the technology budget which includes the provision of contemporary educational programs, relevant software licenses, IT Support and Helpdesk and specialist IT provisions such as the Junior School STEM Room, Virtual Reality Rooms and Astronomy.

FAMILY CONCESSIONS

Where siblings are attending the College at the same time, there is a reduction of 10% in the Tuition Fee for the second son, 15% in the Tuition Fee for the third son and 50% in the Tuition Fee for the fourth son attending at the same time, net of any concessions/scholarships.

DISCOUNT FOR EARLY/FULL PAYMENTS

As a way of thanking you, a 2% discount on net fees will apply if paid in full by **1 March 2025**.

Other than normal classroom instruction, the Junior School Tuition Fee and Resource Fee includes:

PSA Sport, elective subjects, IT Help Desk, Formation Programs, all whole of Year-based excursions, retreats and camps and Pastoral Programs.

Annual charges for Music Tuition are:

40 minute lessons	\$1,990

Pipes & Drums instruction	\$745
Musical Instrument hire	\$365
Equipment Maintenance Fee (Percussion and Pipes & Drums' students)	\$365

Music Tuition Fees are not subject to 2% discount for payment in full, but may be paid in instalments.
