

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This document contains only specific terms and conditions and is not intended to be a comprehensive guide. It should be read in conjunction with the Enrolment Form and the General Conditions and Privacy Policy.

The first payment is payable by **1 March 2026** with final payment due **1 October 2026**.

One Term's notice in writing must be given prior to the removal of an enrolled student, otherwise a full Term's Tuition Fees will be charged.

The College's policy is that one account is issued to the family who signed the enrolment contract and families are expected to make their own private arrangements for payment. A family member is not able to 'remove' themselves from the enrolment contract without the College's and the other signatory's consent.

PARENTS NEW TO THE COLLEGE

There are two charges that are payable when you commence your enquiries with the College:

- **Application Fee** – a non-refundable fee of \$150 inclusive of GST is payable on submission of your online application.
- **Enrolment Fee** – a non-refundable enrolment fee of \$3,000 is payable upon acceptance of a place at the College. The Fee includes TOBA membership which commences at the end of Year 12, with the balance paid to the College's Foundation to assist with the ongoing provision of capital infrastructure.



FEE COLLECTION

The College's finances rely on the prompt payment of fees. Fees will be advised at the commencement of each year with a number of payment options available. Details will be included in the Annual Fees Notification advice.

The College is supportive of families who find themselves in difficult circumstances and early contact should be made with the College's Business Manager to discuss options for assistance.

Out of respect for the many families who pay their College fees regularly and on time, the College will rigorously follow up all overdue school fee accounts. In cases where reminder notices are persistently ignored or arrangements to meet the arrears are not met, the accounts will be referred for legal action to recover the amount outstanding.

Any expenses, costs or disbursements incurred by the College in recovering outstanding monies, including debt collection agency fees and solicitor's costs on an indemnity basis, will be charged to the account.

Students are not eligible to attend College' tours and elective camps and music where fees are overdue and when payment arrangements have not been made with the Business Manager and adhered to.

Please note that special payment arrangements cannot be assumed as continuing and must be re-negotiated periodically with the Business Manager. The final payment each year is required by **1 October 2026** unless prior arrangements have been made.

Any account remaining outstanding after **1 October 2026** may be referred for collection to the College's solicitors.

2026 Fees & Charges

COLLEGE FEES 2026

Trinity College continues to offer an affordable Catholic education in the Edmund Rice Tradition. In 2026, with support of the College Advisory Council and Edmund Rice Education Australia Colleges Ltd, the College has determined the annual College Fees and Charges as detailed below. In determining the fees we have been very mindful of the impact of increases on families.

College Fees consist of a Tuition Fee, Resource Fee a Technology Levy and, for some students, a Laptop Levy. The Tuition Fee contributes funds towards curriculum costs, staff salaries, facility maintenance and some capital expenses. The Tuition Fee has been determined following consideration of Government funding budgeted to be received in 2026.

The Resource Fee assists the funding of camps, retreats, transport, excursions and other resources.

The Technology Levy helps fund the technology budget which includes the provision of contemporary educational programs, relevant software licenses, IT Support and Helpdesk and specialist IT provisions such as the Junior School STEM Room, Virtual Reality Rooms and Astronomy.

The Laptop Levy covers the costs of providing laptops to Senior School students. The program will be progressively rolled out to all Senior School students in 2026, 2027 and 2028.

FAMILY CONCESSIONS

Where siblings are attending the College at the same time, there is a reduction of 10% in the Tuition Fee for the second son, 15% in the Tuition Fee for the third son and 50% in the Tuition Fee for the fourth son, net of any concessions/scholarships.

DISCOUNT FOR EARLY/FULL PAYMENTS

As a way of thanking you, a 2% discount on net fees will apply if fees are paid in full by **1 March 2026**.

Music Tuition Fees are not subject to 2% discount for payment in full, but may be paid in instalments.
